FAMILY CONVERSATIONS

Families, use this to prompt conversations at the table, in the car, and anywhere else your family experiences life together.

- How did the Egyptians and Israelites see God’s power in God’s big story?
- What do you imagine it would have been like to have live through one of the 10 plagues?
- How was Pharaoh’s power different from God’s power?
- In what part of your life would you like to see God’s power?



LIFE CONNECTION

God is Powerful X 10

Ask your kids to think of 10 times or examples they might need God’s power in their life. Write the list on a piece of paper. Divide creating the list evenly among the family members present.

Once the list of 10 examples is complete, read each one aloud. Pause after reading each item, encouraging everyone to say, “God is powerful!”

After the activity, challenge your family members to remember this truth in their life this week. Throughout the week, follow up with your kids, asking them if God’s power helped them through whatever challenge they mentioned.



CREATE

Plague-Dough

Review the 10 plagues with kids by guiding kids to recreate the plagues using playdough. Add some fun by making homemade playdough with your kids before the activity by using the recipe below:

Whisk together 2 ½ cups of flour, ¾ cups of salt, and 2 tablespoons of cream of tartar. Add ¼ cup of vegetable oil and 1 ¼ cups of boiling water. Mix all of this together well. Once it is cool, knead the dough until it is smooth. Have your kids take turns kneading the dough. After the dough reaches the desired texture, mix in food coloring, if desired.

Divide the dough into 10 sections and give family members a section and a plague to make. Help kids reflect on what it would have been like to experience that plague and how God’s power was evident.

End your activity together with a prayer, thanking God for showing His power then and now.
