CREATE IT!

Marshmallow Sheep

Gather the following supplies for your family: a few large marshmallows, a few miniature marshmallows, and a few pretzel sticks. With your kids, create sheep using these items. You could also use coconut flakes, mini chocolate chips, edible eyeballs, etc. They can tear apart the marshmallows and break the pretzel sticks if desired. As you make the sheep, talk about what it means that Jesus is our shepherd. How are we like sheep if Jesus is our shepherd? After you are finished making the sheep, have each person in your family share their creations. Talk about what it means that God cares for us and how we can listen to God's voice this week.

Chalk It Out!

Use sidewalk chalk to create and color a picture of Psalm 23 (or even a fun hopscotch path) on a sidewalk or driveway. Read Psalm 23 together as a family. Make a drawing for each verse. Include a shepherd, green pastures, quiet waters, etc. When your family has finished their sidewalk art of Psalm 23, say a prayer and thank God for the things He provides. Just like a shepherd cares for the sheep, our God cares for us.
