Follow the Light

The author of Psalm 119 refers to God's Word as a lamp for his feet. Help your children understand this concept by showing them how light helps us to see things that we can't see in the dark. Hide a few items around one room in your home that can get dark. Then grab a flashlight and turn out the lights. Tell your kids that we can't see everything when it's dark. However, if we shine a light, we can see those things that were hidden.

Use your flashlight as you walk around the room with your kids and find the items you hid. **The Bible is like a flashlight. God's Word helps us to see the right way to live, and the Bible helps us to know God.** Read Psalm 119:105–106.

HANDS ON

Sweeter Than Honey

In Psalm 119, the psalmist refers to God's words as sweet to his taste and "sweeter than honey." Take a few minutes to taste test and see how honey makes food sweeter and more enjoyable. Your family may pour honey in a hot cup of tea or spread some on a piece of bread or even eat some honey straight from the spoon! After everyone experiences the taste of honey, talk about the taste and whether the honey improved the food. Read Psalm 119:103.

Ask your kids what they think the psalmist means by saying that God's Word is sweeter than honey. **How is God's Word like honey?** Talk together about the different reasons we can enjoy the Bible, much like one might enjoy honey. **In God's Word, we're given instructions for how to live, and we're also shown who God is. When we read the Bible, we realize how much God loves us!**
