WALK IT ACT IT MOVE IT

Shake the Dice

In God's big story, we learned how the Israelites worshiped a golden calf as a god. There's only one who is worthy of all our worship, and that is the one, true God! We can worship God in all kinds of ways!

Invite your child to shake one dice and roll it on a table. Whatever number it lands on, worship God by using the corresponding instructions in the list below. Repeat the activity every day this week as a reminder that only God is worthy of our worship!

- 1—Play your favorite worship song and sing at the top of your lungs!
- 2—Gather your family in a circle and offer a prayer of thanks to God.
- 3—Memorize Ephesians 2:13 by writing it on the bathroom mirror with a dry-erase marker and leave it up all week.
- 4—Take a blanket outside and lie down on it. Look at God's creation and share what you love the most.
- 5—Write letters to God.
- 6—At dinner or before bed, share one way God was with you during your day.



HANDS ON

Flashlight Worship

Every kid loves to make a fort! Collect blankets from around your home and make a blanket fort. Turn off all the lights in the room and give each family member a flashlight. Crawl inside the fort and turn on your flashlights. Take a notebook and pen inside the fort with you.

Remind family members that no matter where they go, who they are with, or what they are doing, they can worship God. Worship is all about turning our hearts toward God and putting Him first. Only God is worthy of our worship!

Help your child make a list of all the places she can think of where she can worship God. Beside each one, write one way to worship God in that place. Consider starting your list with "Worshiping God in our blanket fort." What would that look like?

After you make the list, choose a few ideas to do during the week. Each morning encourage your child to look for ways to worship God in the places she is.
